

- 04<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> July 2005 – Workshop for Curricula Upgrade and Teaching Methods, London, UK

In the first week of July the London South Bank University was working in the final weeks of their semester. Thanks to our host Prof. Dilip Patel we had a chance to be present at the final report staff meeting where the grades of the students were analyzed. This gave us the idea about ongoing process to analyze the curricula and students' achievement and overall picture about quality assurance process.

The workshop showed how curriculum was realized on lectures and how innovations were implemented in the new courses in business, economics, marketing, management and software engineering. A focus was also given both on educational, curricula and computer laboratory utilization aspects. Further on the presentation was given and discussion developed around technology driven courses and the approaches for their implementation in the modern CS curricula as well as the utilization of computer laboratories for various phases of the course delivery. A special attention was given to courses like e-Commerce, e-Business, e-Learning, Cryptography and security as well as Mobile and Ubiquitous computing were explored.

During the visit we had several meetings with staff at London South Bank University and realized several practical issues about course realization. Special attention was given to usage of learning management system, both from professor and student aspects. Various e-Learning tools were presented to members from beneficiary university. A fruitful discussion was realized for implementation details and further development of interactive response system.

We also have seen the facilities, computer labs which helped us a lot in design of the forthcoming establishment of the lab for new innovative technologies. We analyzed computer hardware and software requirements; and organizational issues for lab exercising.
